



Discover one of Africa's most vibrant ancient kingdoms on a journey that will challenge any preconceived ideas about Nigeria. This multinational state boasts an array of ethnic groups including the Hausa, Yoruba, and Igbo just to name a few. The country is rich in stunning natural wonders comprising of rain forests, savannahs, waterfalls, and other natural attractions.

Begin in the capital city of Abuja, surrounded by hills and the enormous monolith, Aso Rock, dominating its skyline. From here, take a short flight to Ilorin, the last site of the Odudwa Dynasty, conquered by Fulani Jihadists in the early 18th century. This is where Islamic life fused with Yoruba culture. In Osogbo, learn the intricacies of Yoruba religion from revered priestesses and in the old city of Abeokuta, admire its grand Afro-Brazilian buildings, and climb the sacred Olumo Rock. The tour ends in Lagos, one of the liveliest cities on earth, full of grime and grit, and includes the coastal town of Badagry, which holds secrets connected to the 17th century slave trade.

Monday, February 03 Arrive in Abuja (NIGERIA)



Upon arrival in **Abuja**, meet the local representative and transfer to *Envoy Suites Hotel or similar* for check-in. There will be a tour briefing from the tour director then enjoy dinner and overnight at the *Hotel*. **(D)**

Note: Check-in time is 3:00 pm. If you arrive on February 02 or in the early morning of February 03, an extra hotel night will need to be reserved.

Dinner will be provided for those arriving prior to 10:00 pm.

Tuesday, February 04 Abuja (Ushafa & Tribes)



Begin the day with an excursion to the **pottery** making village of **Ushafa**, known as the "Bill Clinton Village" after the American President paid a visit in 2000 as part of his Nigerian journey. See firsthand how pottery is made using traditional methods and perhaps even purchase a few of these masterpieces. Next, visit the **Fulani** and **Gwari** tribes in their villages on the outskirts of Abuja for a chance to learn about their ways of life. Enjoy lunch at the *Cilantro Restaurant* featuring Indian and Asian cuisine. Head to visit the **National Mosque** and then return to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Note: Women should consider bringing a scarf to cover their heads as a show of respect.

Wednesday, February 05 Abuja - Ilorin



After an early breakfast, transfer to the airport for the flight to **Ilorin**, first settled by the Yoruba ethnic group in the mid-1400s. once we arrive, begin exploring the **Aro traditional weaving** quarters, where Ilorin's renowned weavers plan their trade. Visit the **Palace of the Emir**, which houses some historical artifacts, then enjoy lunch at a local restaurant offering a variety of choices. Transfer to *Noktel Hotel or similar* for check-in, then have the rest of the day free at leisure. Enjoy dinner at a local restaurant then return to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Note: The maximum weight limit for hand luggage is 6 kg/13 lb. and the rule is strictly enforced.

Thursday, February 06 Ilorin - Esie - Osogbo



Begin the day with a drive to **Esie**, stopping at the **Esie Museum**, to see its large collection of soapstone sculptures believed to have been excavated in 1775 AD. Continue the drive to the city of **Osogbo**, and have lunch at a quick service restaurant. In the afternoon, visit the **Nike Arts & Cultural Center**, to learn the production of Adire (tie-dye) fabrics and perhaps purchase some of the fabrics. Transfer to *Ideal Nest Hotel* for check-in, rest of the day is free at leisure, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Friday, February 07 Osogbo



Spend the day exploring the city of Osogbo, home to one of Nigeria's few UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Visit the Sacred Grove of Osun, where extraordinary sculptures of Yoruba deities are nestled among the trees, and monkeys run amok. After lunch at a quick service restaurant, visit a traditional Orisha temple, where Ife priestesses explain the intricacies of their religion; a truly fascinating experience, and one not to be missed. Time permitting, visit the home of Adunni Olorisa -Suzanne Wenger to learn about her life and works in the Nigerian Yoruba cultures and traditions. Return to the Hotel for some free time, a buffet dinner, and overnight. (B,L,D) Note: For today's approx. 3.5-hour walk through the forest with exposure to the sun, we highly recommend bringing along a hat, sunscreen, good walking shoes, and a walking stick.

Saturday, February 08 Osogbo - Ile Ife - Abe<u>okuta</u>



After breakfast, begin the drive to **Abeokuta**, stopping en route at **Ile-Ife**, home of **Oduduwa** (the legendary father of the Yoruba race). Visit the **Palace of the Ooni of Ife**, the traditional head of the kingdom and spiritual leader of the Yoruba. See the **Oranmiyan Staff**, a 16-foot-tall granite obelisk believed to represent the staff that Oranmiyan, the grandson of Oduduwa, carried to war. From **Oranmiyan Grove**, visit the **Moremi Shrine** and then continue to **Abeokuta**, upon our arrival in the evening, transfer to *Park Inn by Radisson or similar* for check-in then head out for dinner at a local restaurant, then back to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Sunday, February 09 Abeokuta - Lagos

Begin the day with a visit to **Olumo Rock**, the place where the Egba clan supposedly hid during the Yoruba Wars in the 19th century and establishing a powerful kingdom. The rock is 300-feet high equipped with both stairs and elevator. Caves in the rock include remains of a settlement with a small shrine where a donation/offering may be expected. Explore Abeokuta, known for its Afro-Brazilian architecture - impressive buildings made for local merchants by freed slaves who returned from Brazil. Though some facades are in disrepair, the pastel colors and ornate designs make it a charming historical scene. Explore the colorful Adire Mall, a cloth and textile market. There is also a fetish market and sites where local voodoo items and herbs, or animal remains are used for traditional medicines or offerings; both fascinating and disturbing for some visitors. From the voodoo market, visit the Kuti Heritage Museum, the former home of the Kuti family, including famous Afrobeat musician, Fela Anikulapo Kuti. After lunch at a local restaurant, continue the drive to Lagos and upon arrival transfer to Radisson Hotel Ikeja or similar for check-in, dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

Note: When visiting Olumo Rock, it's worth noting that the elevator service is frequently unavailable. To fully enjoy your experience, we highly recommend bringing along a hat, sunscreen, good walking shoes, and a walking stick.

Monday, February 10 Lagos (Badagry)



From the mainland, transfer to Lagos Island to visit the **National Museum,** which houses and array of artifacts and antiquities from all over Nigeria. Then, travel by boat through the lagoon to the coastal town of Badagry, a major port for the export of African slaves to the Americas. Explore some of its most interesting historical sites and learn about slave trade in this region. Visits include the Velekete Slave Market, the family home of Seriki Williams Abass, a famous slave turned slavemerchant during the 19th century, and the Badagry **Heritage Museum** containing collections from the slave trade including relics used to restrain slaves such as leg locks, neck chains, and mouth padlocks. After lunch, enjoy a lively cultural performance by the Zangbeto, traditional voodoo guardians of the night for the Egun people. Return to the Hotel for dinner & overnight. (B,L,D)

Note: We highly recommend bringing a hat and sunscreen, as temperatures can exceed 100° F.

Tuesday, February 11 Lagos



Begin the day with a visit to the **Kalakuta Museum** to learn more about the life and career of Fela Anikulapo Kuti, founder of the Afrobeat music genre. Visit the **Lekki Conservation Center**, a nature lovers' haven followed by the **Nike Art Gallery** to savor some of the country's most impressive African traditional and contemporary arts

collection. We will have a chance to do some last minute souvenir shopping at the **Elegushi International Art Market** and then return to the *Hotel* in the late afternoon rest of the day will be free at leisure, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Wednesday, February 12 Lagos - USA



Enjoy breakfast and then transfer to the airport for your onward flight back to the US. **(B)**

Note: standard check-out time is 11:00 am. Any late check-outs past this time will be subject to an additional charge for a day-use room.

- Domestic flights may change without prior notice that may necessitate amending the itinerary.
- This trip involves long drives in hot weather over poorly maintained and very bumpy roads. Those with bad spines, knees or other medical conditions may find the drives uncomfortable.
- There are a lack of modern medical facilities and chronic health problems should be discussed with your physician before joining this tour.
