Tuesday, June 03 Arrive in Funchal (MADEIRA)



Upon arrival in **Funchal** in the late evening, and after passing through the customs, meet the local guide and transfer to *Melia Madeira Mare Hotel or similar* for checkin and overnight.

Wednesday, June 04 Funchal (City Tour)



Begin the day exploring Funchal, the largest city on the island of **Madeira** and the seventh most populated city in Portugal. This vibrant capital of Madeira offers historic charm, stunning gardens, delectable cuisine, and scenic waterfront views, making it a must-visit destination. Start the day in Funchal Old Town, where cobblestone streets and historic, colorful buildings adorn the landscape. Within Old Town lies Mercado dos Lavradores, a great place to purchase local crafts or produce. Visit Sé **Cathedral**, an impressive Gothic-style cathedral that dates back to the 15th century. Take a cable car ride up to the hilltop village of **Monte**. Here lies *scenic views* of the harbor and the Monte Palace Tropical Garden, a botanical garden renowned for its diverse collection of back to the *hotel* for dinner plants. Head overnight. (B,L,D)

Thursday, June 05 Funchal (Santana & Machico)



After breakfast, head to the north part of the beginning with the town of **Santana**, known for its lush vegetation. Head to the **Parque das Queimadas**, a *UNESCO World Heritage Site* with a corresponding environmental education center and Walk amongst waterfalls and wildlife at the **Levada du Furado**. Visit **São Jorge Chapel**, featuring a picturesque backdrop perfect for photography. Next, head to the coastal town of **Machico**.

Visit **Forte de São João Baptista**, a historic fortress with panoramic coast views. See **Igreja Matriz de Machico**, a 15th-century church *filled with stunning art and architecture*. Head back to the *Hotel* in Funchal for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Friday, June 06 Funchal (Cabo Girão)



Today, take a short drive to Cabo Girão, a town renowned for its **towering sea cliffs**, reaching 1,900 feet. Cabo Girão offers awe-inspiring panoramic views of the Atlantic Ocean. Visitors can experience the thrill of walking on the glass-floored Skywalk at the cliff's edge. The rugged coastline, lush vegetation, and azure waters create a stunning backdrop for photography enthusiasts and nature lovers. Cabo offers outdoor activities such as hiking, paragliding, and rock climbing. Nearby attractions like the charming fishing village of **Camara de Lobos** offer a glimpse into daily life in Madeira. Return to the Hotel for dinner & overnight. (B,L,D)

Saturday, June 07 Funchal - Las Palmas (GRAN CANARIA)



After breakfast, there will be some brief leisure time to walk around the town before an early afternoon wine tasting at H. M Borges Winery or similar. Portugal is one of Europe's largest wine producers. Madeira wine ranges from dry to sweet and it undergoes a unique aging process, exposed to heat and oxygen, producing a distinctive caramelized taste. After the wine tasting, transfer to the airport for our evening flight to Las Palmas, Gran Canaria, the largest city on Spain's Canary Islands island. Upon arrival, meet the local guide and transfer to the Occidental Hotel or similar for check-in and overnight. (B,L,D)

Sunday, June 08 Las Palmas (City Tour)

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After breakfast, begin the day with a visit to the **Vegueta**, a charming and historic district a stone's throw from the waterfront. This historic district looks as though it was transported directly from mainland **Spain**. Stop at the **Santa Ana Cathedral** and **Casa de Colón** for the best glimpse of the island's past. Then, head to **Pueblo Canario**, a picturesque complex celebrating *Canarian culture*. After lunch, return to the *Hotel* for a free afternoon at leisure to enjoy the beach or relax—dinner and overnight at the *Hotel*. **(B,L,D)**

Monday, June 09

Teror - Roque Nublo - Badama Caldera

Venture inland to Teror, a charming town located in the interior of Gran Canaria. See Basilica of Our Lady of the Pine. This stunning church is a blend of Gothic and Neoclassical styles. Plaza del Pino is the focal point of Teror, lined with historic buildings, cafes, and shops. Continue to the center of Gran Canaria: Roque Nublo, a volcanic rock formation that rises 80 meters (262 feet) tall. It is part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site known as the "Risco Caído." Head back toward Las Palmas with a stop at the famed Badama Caldera along the way. The Badama Caldera is an ancient volcanic crater formed by volcanic eruptions millions of years ago. Return to the Hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

Tuesday, June 10

Northern Gran Canaria - Valle de Agaete

After breakfast, begin the drive to Northern Gran Canaria to see the natural wonders of the island. Northern Gran Canaria is known for its rugged coastline, charming villages, and natural beauty. Visit the town of Agaete, a coastal town nestled in the northwest of Gran Canaria. It is famous for its natural pools, Puerto de las Nieves, and the impressive Dedo de Dios (Finger of God) rock formation, which unfortunately collapsed due to erosion in 2005. Agaete is also renowned for its coffee plantations and charming streets with whitewashed houses. The valley has a rich agricultural heritage and is famous for cultivating tropical fruits. Explore the terraced fields and orchards that offer a glimpse into traditional Canarian farming. Return to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

Wednesday, June 11

Mogán - Maspalomas - Guayadeque

Today, we will cover Southern Gran Canaria, beginning with a trip to the quaint town of **Mogán**, renowned for its charming marina and often referred to as "Little Venice" due to its network of canals lined with colorful buildings. The marina has luxury yachts, fishing boats, and waterfront restaurants. The town boasts a beautiful sandy beach, Playa de Mogán, which offers calm waters ideal for swimming and sunbathing. Continue to **Maspalomas**, famous for its stunning beaches, including **Playa de Maspalomas and Playa del Inglés**. One of the most iconic features of Maspalomas is its extensive dunes,

which form a natural reserve known as the **Dunas de Maspalomas**. Then, head to **Guayadeque**, a ravine known for its unique landscape. It is famous for its pre-Hispanic cave dwellings, once inhabited by the island's indigenous people, the **Guanches**. Return to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Thursday, June 12

Las Palmas - Ponta Delgada (AZORES)

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for our afternoon flight to the **Azores** through Lisbon. Upon arrival in **Ponta Delgada**, meet the local guide and transfer to *Octant Hotel or similar* for check-in, dinner and overnight. **(B,D)**

Friday, June 13

Sete Cidades - Caldeira Seca



Begin the day heading northwest of Ponta Delgada to Sete **Cidades,** a *breathtaking* area renowned for its stunning Twin lakes, Lagoa Azul (Blue Lake) & Lagoa Verde (Green Lake), which are set within the crater of a dormant volcano. The Lakes' distinct colors, caused by the reflection of sunlight on the water and the surrounding vegetation, create a mesmerizing landscape. The village is known for its charming **houses** and historic **church**. Not far from Sete Cidades lies Calderia Seca, a geological formation characterized by its rocky terrain. The caldera was formed by volcanic activity millions of years ago and is now home to a unique ecosystem adapted to the arid conditions. Enjoy hiking trails that trace the caldera's rim, offering panoramic countryside and coastline views. The area is also famous for birdwatching. Return to the Hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

Saturday, June 14

Furnas - Lagoa do Fogo



Begin a scenic drive east to Furnas, home to Lagoa das Furnas, a stunning crater lake that showcases an unparalleled landscape. Furnas features geothermal activity in bubbling hot springs, fumaroles, and mud pots. These natural phenomena provide opportunities for relaxation and wellness treatments in local spas. Visit a local restaurant to try one of the most iconic dishes of the Azores: Cozido das Furnas, a traditional stew cooked underground using the natural heat of the volcanic soil. Head to Lagoa do Fogo, another crater lake that translates to "Lake of Fire." The lake's waters are incredibly clear and have a striking blue-green hue, creating a tranquil and picturesque scene. It is not uncommon to see steam rising from the surface due to geothermal activity. Return to the Hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

Sunday, June 15 Ponta Delgada (City Tour)

Spend the final day in the Azores, taking in the sights and sounds of the archipelago's main settlement: **Ponta Delgada.** The city offers a rich blend of landmarks and sights that reflect its historical, cultural, and natural

heritage. See the **Portas da Cidade** (City Gates), which marks the entrance to the city's historic center. **São**

Sebastião Church is a striking *Baroque* church that boasts beautiful architecture and interior decorations, including ornate altars and azulejo tilework. **Fortaleza de São Brás (São Brás Fortress)** is a historic fortress that dates back to the 16th century and offers panoramic views of Ponta Delgada and its harbor. It now houses the **Azores Military Museum**. See the **Parque Atlântico Shopping Center**, the largest shopping center in the Azores, offering many shops, restaurants, and entertainment options. **Gruta do Carvão** (Coal Cave) is a fascinating underground lava tube system stretching several miles beneath Ponta Delgada. Free time at leisure to walk in the city before heading back to the *Hotel* for dinner & overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Monday, June 16 Ponta Delgada - USA



Transfer to the airport for your flight back to the US. (B) Note: Standard check out time is 11:00 AM, In the event of a late departure, you can either leave your luggage at the concierge or alternatively you can reserve a dayuse room until your scheduled transfer to the airport (cost is separate).

For those Planning to visit Cape Verde

Monday, June 16 Ponta Delgada - Praia (CAPE VERDE)



Early morning transfer to the airport for our flight to **Cape Verde.** Upon arrival in **Praia**, meet the local guide and venture to the city's historical center. Embark on a fascinating **walking tour** through colonial buildings. Pass by monuments honoring the island's discoverers, freedom fighters, and local artists at the **Palace of Culture**. Revel in the city's settlement history at the **Presidential Palace**. Continue the journey to the lively **Municipal Market** and mingle with locals while discovering diverse local fruits and vegetables. Explore the **Sucupira Market**, capturing the essence of local stories and island culture. Enjoy a special lunch in an authentic setting then transfer to *Pestana Trópico Hotel or similar* for check-in and overnight. **(B,L)**

Tuesday, June 17 Praia (Calabaceira & Cidade Velha)



After breakfast, depart toward the small village of **Calabaceira**. Start the 3-hour simple hike on the accessible trail and explore the green valley famous for **its baobab trees**, which **Charles Darwin** mentioned, and its use as an escape route for enslaved people during slavery. Experience the production of a local **rum-making distillery**. Get the opportunity to meet local farmers and learn about their agricultural fields, such as sugar cane, mango trees, cassava, bananas, and more. Once we arrive in **Cidade Velha**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, visit

the **São Francisco Convent**, **Banana Street**, and **Nossa Senhora do Rosário church**. Enjoy a local lunch on the seafront, then head to see the former **slave market**, the ruins of **the Sé Catedral**, and the **Royal Fortress of São Filipe**. From the top, enjoy a beautiful view of the whole old town and learn about the defense system used against pirates. Return to the *Hotel* for dinner & overnight. **(B,L)**

Wednesday, June 18 Praia (Assomada & Serra Malagueta NP.)



Begin the day exploring the interior of the island. First stop at a **local house** to sample **cuscus** (a traditional cake made from corn flour) and **fidjós** (fried banana), the typical meal for Cape Verdean families. Continue to the city of **Assomada**, and head to visit the **famous market**. Head to **Serra Malagueta Natural Park** and marvel at the incredible views from 3,280 feet above sea level. Explore the chilling remnants of the **Chao Bom concentration camp**, a testament to Portugal's Salazar dictatorship. Learn about the political prisoners who suffered under authoritarian rule. Discover **Tarrafal Beach**, known for its white sand and crystal-clear waters. Visit the **Rabelados religious community**, which preserves the oldest customs of Cape Verde. Return to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L)**

Thursday, June 19 Praia (Serra Malagueta Park)



Head to the mountains for a breathtaking hike through **Serra da Malagueta Natural Park**. The trail begins in fertile areas at an altitude of 2,790 feet above sea level, taking us through the stunning lush landscapes of the park. There are over 124 plant species and 19 bird species. The guide will share fascinating insights into the local flora and fauna. Return to the starting point and head to the **Cuba Pool**, an untamed natural pool formed from ancient lava eruptions from **Ribeira das Pratas**. Take a refreshing dip in the crystal-clear waters while the host prepares a barbecue featuring fresh fish. Return to the *Hotel* in Praia for overnight. **(B,L)**

Friday, June 20 Praia - USA OR Continue to São Tomé



After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight back to the US. **(B)**
