Friday, September 27 Arrive in Belgrade (SERBIA)



Upon arrival in **Serbia** (depending on your arrival time), meet and transfer to the *Hotel* for check-in and overnight. **(D)**

Note: Standard check-in time is 3:00 pm. if you arrive on Sep 26 or early morning of Sep 27; an extra hotel night needs to be booked.

Saturday, September 28 Belgrade



Begin the day with a city tour of Belgrade, including a visit to the City Hall, the National Parliament, the Old Palace, the Slavija Square, Terazije street and Square, Republic and Nikola Pasic Square, Knez Mihailova Street - the main pedestrian area of downtown, Albania Tower, Skadarlija a bohemian street, the National **Theater**, **Saint Sava's Temple**. Enjoy a walk through the beautiful **Kalemegdan** Park and the fascinating Belgrade fortress with an unforgettable view of the confluence of two big European rivers, the Danube and the Sava. Have free time at leisure before heading for dinner at a local restaurant in Skadarlija, a famous bohemian quarter of Belgrade, then return to the *Hotel* for our overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Sunday, September 29 Belgrade - Skopje (MACEDONIA)



After breakfast, begin the day with a drive to **Skopje**, stopping en route at **Nis**, where we will enjoy a snack or lunch. Continue driving to **Skopje** and upon arrival, transfer to the *Hotel* for check-in, dinner, and overnight **(B,L,D)**

Monday, September 30 Skopje - Bitola - Ohrid



After breakfast, begin the day with a city tour of **Skopje**. Our panoramic tour will include a visit to the **old Railway station**, **Mother Teresa memorial house**, the **Stone Bridge**, **Daut Pasha Amam** (outside) – the monument of Islamic architecture, and the **church St. Spas**; have a short walking tour of the **old town** and its **bazaar**. Continue to **Bitola** (2.5 hrs.), and upon arrival, enjoy lunch at one of the traditional restaurants; then start the city tour with a visit to the **Heraklea site**,

including Mangolia square, the statue of Philip the 2nd and the pedestrian street with an ottoman architecture feel, the Clock Tower and St. Demetrius church. Continue to Heraklea's archaeological site & discover the well-preserved ruins of the Roman baths, the baptistery and the Episcopal Church, the Jewish temple, Portico, and an ancient theater. Continue the drive to Ohrid (1.5 hrs.), upon arrival, transfer to the *Hotel* for check-in, dinner, and overnight. (B,L,D)

Tuesday, October 01 Ohrid (St. Naum)



After breakfast, begin the day with a city tour of Ohrid, including the Ohrid Fortifications; Church of St. Sophia, St. Bogorodica Perivlepta, St. Jovan Kaneo from outside, St. Pantelejmon, Plaosniz from outside Old Bazaar, Antique Theatre, Ohrid Traditional Architecture. Enjoy lunch at one of the traditional restaurants in the old town, then head for a boat tour of Ohrid Lake. In the afternoon, head to visit the Monastic Complex of St. Naum, then return to the Hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

Wednesday, October 02 Ohrid - Berat (ALBANIA)



Begin the day with a drive (4 hrs.), where we will cross into the city of **Berat** (Albania), and after crossing the borders, head for lunch at a local restaurant. Berat is known as the "City of one thousand windows" and is declared a Museum City." Berat, overshadowed to the east by Tomorr Mountain (1.5 miles), is an ancient Illyrian settlement founded in the 4th century B.C. on the territory of the Illyrian tribe of Desarettes. The town comprises 3 parts; Gorica, situated on the far side of the river; Mangalem, situated on the fortress side of the river and the Residential quarter within the fortress known as Kalaja. The old part of the city has some religious buildings like a mosque and Byzantine churches. Visit the **fortress** and **Onufri Museum**. Enjoy dinner inner and then transfer to the Hotel for check-in and overnight. (B,L,D)

Thursday, October 03 Berat - Gjirokastra - Saranda

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After breakfast, depart to Gjirokastra (3.5 hrs.) with a stop en route for refreshments. Upon arrival, start with a visit to the Castle of Gjirokastra; hurtling through the sweeping plains of the Drino Valley, the ancient Ottoman city appears suddenly and unexpectedly, clattering up the steep slopes of the Gjerë Mountains high above the patchwork of verdant farmlands that paint this corner of Albania a vibrant, hazy green. Standing guard across the valley, the imposing Gjirokastra Fortress dominates the skyline amidst a sea of slate grey rooftops that hide a veritable labyrinth of cobbled alleyways and hidden staircases made for wandering. A place to put away the map and get well and truly lost. Visit the Castle of **Gjirokastra** and enjoy some free time in the bazaar. Have a traditional lunch at a local restaurant, then continue driving to **Saranda** (1.5 hrs.) and upon arrival, transfer to the *Hotel* for check-in, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Friday, October 04 Saranda - Butrint - Vlora



After breakfast, begin the day with a visit to Butrint Archaeological Park (40 min). This impressive walking tour will stir your imagination about the ancient world during the peak of Roman power and classical Greek mythology. Start with the Asclepius temple, theatre, Roman portico and baths, early Christian baptistery, byzantine basilica, defensive walls, and impressive gates. Enjoy lunch in Ksamili. After lunch, departure to Vlora through the fabulous Albanian Riviera. (4.5 hrs.). The stretch of coastline dubbed the 'Albanian Riviera' stretches from the Roman theatre of Butrint in the south to the remote Karaburun Peninsula in the north, Along the way, the Riviera takes in easy-going beach towns, forested mountain passes, bird- and terrapin-filled marshes, noisy resort towns, and brilliant snorkeling spots. Transfer to the *Hotel* for check-in, dinner, and overnight. (B,L,D)

Saturday, October 05 Vlora - Ardenica - Durres - Tirana



After breakfast, head to Ardenica Monastery for a visit, located 777 feet above sea level, then head to the Ardenica hills, famous for the Monastery of the Nativity of the Theotokos and many breathtaking landscapes. A pagan temple dedicated to the goddess Artemis existed where the monastery sits now, which explains the origin of the name Ardenica. The monastery was built in 282 and commissioned by the emperor Andronikos II Palaiologos of Byzantium. Perhaps the most interesting historical event recorded in Ardenica is Skanderbeg's wedding to his lifelong wife Donika, hosted on April of 1451 at the Chapel of St. Trinity Church, the monastery's very first church, built in the 10th century. Visit the most famous St. Mary's Church (Kisha e Shën Mërisë). Continue driving to Durres (1.15 hrs.) and upon arrival, have lunch at a local restaurant; then have a city tour of **Durres** where we will explore the ruins of the town forum, the Roman baths, the city center, the Town Hall, the Roman Amphitheatre, the Byzantine Walls, and the Venetian tower, a panoramic display of discoveries and urban planning of this once an important city. Continue driving to Tirana and transfer to the Hotel for check-in, dinner, and overnight. (B,L,D)

Sunday, October 06 Tirana - Kruja



After breakfast, begin the day exploring the capital city of Albania, including some of the historical highlights, such as the City Centre, Skanderbeg Statue, Et'hem Bey Mosque, Clock tower, Italian buildings, and Martyrs of the Nation Boulevard. Then head to visit the excommunist buildings, painted with vibrant colors and the expansion of the city. Visit of National Historical **Museum and** enjoy lunch at a local restaurant. Continue the drive to **Kruja** and begin the walking tour, which will take through the cobblestone pathway of the Ottoman bazaar, with wooden shops and displays of various gifts and antique household items. Visit within the walls of an old house that was turned into an ethnographic museum will invite you to a unique cultural aspect of life in northern Albania. Transfer to the Hotel for check-in, dinner, and overnight. (B,L,D)

Monday, October 07



Kruja - Prizren (KOSOVO) - Decani - Pej

After breakfast, begin the drive to **Prizren** (3.5 hrs.), in the newly created state of **Kosovo**. Visit the **old town** of Prizren. Discover Prizren the cradle of cultural wealth of Kosovo people. The walking tour includes visits to the Old town with its **Ottoman bridge**, **water fountain**, their unique **mosques** and **orthodox churches**. The city is known for its rich culinary tradition, mainly home-made products and dishes. Lunch in the old town. Visit of **Decan Monastery**. **Visoki Decani Monastery**, the first cultural monument on the territory of Kosovo, to be inscribed in the list of UNESCO World Heritage has long been known as one of the architecturally most interesting and best preserved Serbian medieval churches. Continue to Pej and transfer to the *Hotel* for check-in and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Tuesday, October 08 Pej - Fierza Lake - Koman Lake - <u>Shkodra</u>



Depart in the early morning (6:00 am) to **Fierza Ferry Terminal** (Albania). Fierza and Koman Lake were formed when the rugged Drini valley was dammed in the early 1970s, allowing Albania to quickly develop its industrial base and become an energy exporter. The huge lake behind the Vau Dejes dam contains some 320 million cubic meters of water and stretches 18 miles eastward to the town of Fierza, the location of a second dam that holds back another lake that goes all the way to Kukes near the Kosovo border. The boat trip passes between 3280-4921 feet high mountains and through a series of deep gorgeous, interconnected lakes, with hardly any signs of human activities on the shores – though occasionally, the

ferry will stop to let off some hardy. Continue driving to **Shkodra**, Budva, with a stop en route for lunch and refreshments (2hrs). Transfer to the Hotel for check-in, dinner, and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Note: If the boat tour is cancelled due to weather conditions; in such case, you will visit Shkodra city, considered the capital of North Albania

Wednesday, October 09 Shkodra - Kotor - Budva (MONTENEGRO)

After breakfast, drive to **Kotor** (40 min). Located along one of the world's most beautiful bays is Kotor, a city of traders and famous sailors with many stories to tell. The **Old City** of Kotor is well-preserved urbanization typical of the Middle Ages, built between the 12th and 14th centuries. Medieval architecture and numerous cultural heritage monuments have made Kotor land on the list of UNESCO's World Natural and Historical Heritage Sites. Visit **St. Tryphon Cathedral** and have some free time in the old town. Later enjoy a boat ride to the **Lady on the Rock Island**. Return to **Budva** and have some free time in the old town, then transfer to the *Hotel* for check-in, dinner, and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Thursday, October 10 Budva - Dubrovnik (CROATIA)



After breakfast, drive to Dubrovnik (2.5hrs). Upon arrival, start with the walking tour. Whether it is the first visit to Dubrovnik or the hundredth, the sense of awe never fails to descend when we set our eyes on the beauty of the old town. Indeed, it is hard to imagine anyone becoming jaded by the city's white limestone streets, baroque buildings, and the endless shimmer of the Adriatic or failing to be inspired by a walk along the ancient city walls that protected a civilized, sophisticated republic for centuries. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant on the way to Dubrovnik, and upon arrival in the city, transfer to the *Hotel* for check-in, dinner, and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Friday, October 11 Dubrovnik - Mostar - Sarajevo (BOSNIA & HERZEGOVINA)



Begin the day with a drive towards Bosnia & Herzegovina, with a stop en route for refreshments. Upon arrival, enjoy lunch at a local restaurant, then in the afternoon, have a walking tour of Mostar, this little charming old town, listed under UNESCO Heritage sites, is enriched with lots of colors of traditional handicrafts productions which have played an essential role in the history of Bosnia. The old bridge and several other buildings were recently restored and rebuilt thanks to UNESCO's support. Visit the Turkish House and understand better the way of living in Bosnia. Don't forget to taste the traditional Bosnian Coffee and spend some free time in the bazaar. Continue to Sarajevo, and upon arrival, transfer to the Hotel for check-in, dinner, and overnight. (B,L,D)

Saturday, October 12 Sarajevo



After breakfast, start the tour of **Sarajevo**, one of Europe's most oriental and culturally diverse cities, which spent over 300 years under Turkish rule until the Austro-Hungarians arrived in the late nineteenth century. The empire collapsed 50 years later when Archduke Ferdinand was assassinated here, hastening the outbreak of the First World War.

Visit **Tunnel of Hope** and learn about this tristful history of the siege of Sarajevo. Explore the **old town** and the **bazaar**, with its typical shops and great opportunity to interact with local folks. Return to the Hotel for dinner overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Sunday, October 13 Sarajevo - USA



After breakfast transfer to the airport for your flight back to the US. **(B)**
