



CABINDA

A SEMI AUTONOMOUS ENCLAVE OF ANGOLA

October 05 - October 07, 2024
Led by Local Guide

Tiny Cabinda is a place you have only heard of if you are an offshore driller or follow soccer. It is located north of Angola and between a sliver of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and the Republic of Congo. It was only added to the Travelers Century Club (TCC) recently. The city of Cabinda itself is not much to talk about - the main attractions are the church and the enormous statue of Pope John Paul II along the beachfront. Although quite pleasant, once you leave the city and head north, it becomes much prettier in the smaller towns, and there is little traffic. Chevron owns Cabinda, which has the richest oil deposits in Africa, and about one-third of the entire enclave is fenced off. This is positive and a negative, of course. It is yet another example of the West exploiting Africa. Still, in doing so, it provides jobs to many locals who would otherwise be working menial jobs in agriculture, if that. Another feature is a soccer stadium built in 2010 to host some African Cup of Nations games. A colossal waste of money, the stadium will likely be used only sparingly, if at all again, but it's something to see. Geographically, Cabinda is mainly a tropical forest with some scenic lakes. A one-day excursion is plenty of time to explore this little-known enclave.

Saturday, October 05
Arrive in Luanda



Upon arrival in **Luanda**, the capital of **Angola**, meet the guide and transfer to *Thomson Art House or similar* for check-in and overnight.

Sunday, October 06
Luanda - Cabinda - Luanda



Transfer to the airport in the early morning for our flight to **Cabinda**, an enclave of Angola. Enjoy breakfast at a local restaurant, and then spend some time covering the major **city sites**. Visit **Tchizo** to meet the mysterious **Bakama**, a secret religious group that performs **masked dances** or events such as the installation of chiefs, funerals,

purification rituals, etc. The dancers wear large elaborate masks and intricate costumes made of dried banana leaves that are burned after the performance. Also, visit the **Mayombe forest**, an area covered by secondary dense tropical rainforests and home to western lowland gorillas, chimpanzees, forest elephants, African grey parrots, etc. Later, drive back to the airport for our evening flight back to Luanda and return to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L)**

Monday, October 07
Luanda

Free morning at leisure, and overnight at the *Hotel*. **(B)**
