Professor Jennifer L. Fluri...is an Associate Professor in the Department of Geography at the University of Colorado-Boulder. She is a political geographer interested in gender, geopolitics, international aid/development, conflict, and peace building in Afghanistan. She has published over twenty peer reviewed journal articles and co-authored a book with Rachel Lehr entitled The Carpetbaggers of Kabul and other American Afghan Entanglements, published in 2017 by University of Georgia Press as part of the Geographies of Social Justice series. She is one of



four co-authors of the 2017 book Feminist Spaces: Gender and Geography in a Global Context published by Routledge. She is currently working on a book that explores gender and geographies of peace building and conflict mediation in Afghanistan, sponsored by the United States Institute of Peace.

Her upcoming research project focuses on Afghan women's political influence and the diverse experiences of Afghan women's political activism, funded by the National Science Foundation. At the University of Colorado, she teaches several courses including the Geographies of South Asia; Islam, Geopolitics and Society; Research Methods, Feminist Geography, and Geographies of International Development. She also co-directs the Boulder Affordable Housing Research Initiative, a community-based service-research project that provides information for individuals and organizations seeking, living in, or caring about affordable housing.
