As the countryside is dotted with medieval towers, wayside chapels and the oldest known human structures in the world, the Islands have rightly been described as an open-air museum. The Maltese archipelago lies virtually at the center of the Mediterranean and consists of three islands: Malta, Gozo, and Comino.

Monday, April 21 Arrive in Valletta (MALTA)



Upon arrival at **Malta International airport**, meet your guide and transfer to *Victoria Hotel* located to the seafront for check-in, the rest of the day is free at leisure and overnight at the *Hotel*. **(D)**

Tuesday, April 22 Valletta (Central Malta and the Old Capital)



After breakfast, begin the full day tour of the central and western parts of the island with a drive to the **Dingli Cliff**, which are the highest point on the Maltese Islands (253 meters) above sea level. The Cliff offers a majestic, and overlooking the small, terraced fields below, the open sea and Filfla & the small uninhabited island. Visit **Mdina**, the old capital city of the island, and the Silent and Medieval city also known by its titles "Città Vecchia" or "Città Notabile", a fortified city in the Northern Region of Malta, which served as the island's capital from antiquity to the medieval period. The city was founded as Maleth around the 8th century BC by Phoenician settlers and was later renamed "Melite" by the Romans.

Enjoy lunch at an authentic cuisine in the narrow back streets of Rabat to enjoy a Maltese dish, then head to visit St. Paul's Church and Grotto, as well as the St. Paul's **Catacombs** in the suburb town of Rabat, which are a typical complex of interconnected underground Roman cemeteries, that where in use up to the 4th century AD. They are a fascinating labyrinth of the 3rd century AD subterranean tombs and the earliest archaeological evidence of Christianity in Malta. The Arabs, during their 200 years of rule, divided the old Roman City of Melita into two: the citadel became known as *Mdina* and the rest of the area as Rabat. The Christian, Jewish and Pagan Catacombs of St. Paul are not associated with Paul but derive their name from their proximity to St. Paul's Church and Grotto. Also head to visit the Mosta Dome **Church**, the 3rd largest unsupported dome in the world after St. Peter's in Rome and St. Paul's in London.

End the day at **Palazzo Parisio**, sometimes called the "miniature Versailles of Malta" with its ornate interior and shaped gardens located in the town of Naxxar. Enjoy a luxurious high tea experience before returning to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Wednesday, April 23 Valletta (City tour)



After breakfast, begin the drive to the capital city, Valletta. Our first full day introduction to Malta is in the grand baroque city of Valletta. It has been said that it is the city that was "Built by Gentlemen for Gentlemen". Your guide will take you along Republic, Merchant, and Old Bakery Street.

Visit the Malta Experience film depicting the complete history of the Islands and on to Hospital of the Knights of St. John. Enjoy lunch at an Old Bakery that turned into a traditional restaurant, then in the afternoon, head to visit St. John's Co-Cathedral, the mother church of the Knights of St. John; a historical gem, which houses famous tapestries by the artist Caravaggio. Visit the Upper Barrakka Gardens with their spectacular views of the Grand Harbor. Built by the Knights of St. John in 1567 after the Great Siege by the Ottoman Empire, Valletta remains a stronghold of the Maltese. Return to the Hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

Thursday, April 24



Valletta (Senglea, Cospicua and Vittorisa)

Enjoy breakfast, then begin the drive to the historical cities of **Senglea**, **Cospicua** and **Vittoriosa**, the first bases of the Knights of St. John. In **Senglea**, visit the **Gardjola Gardens**, which overlook the harbor and the historical viewing tower also the symbols sculptured of an eye, an ear, and the crane bird, representing guardianship and observance protecting the Maltese shores.

Continue the drive to **Cospicua**, a beautiful quaint town, then onto **Vittoriosa**, which witnessed the victory of the Great Siege, hence its name. In Vittoriosa, visit the **Inquisitor's Palace**, where the Inquisition played a very

important role in the island's history, as it did in Europe at that time. Walk through the old town, which houses the various residences of the Knights, the Auberges, then on to the water's edge. Then, head to visit the **Maritime museum**, for a brief explanation of Malta's maritime history. Enjoy lunch at a restaurant on the water's edge then return to the *Hotel*, for some rest. in the late afternoon, head out to **Ta' Marija Restaurant** and enjoy dinner and a folklore show at the Ta' Marija Restaurant hen return to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Friday, April 25 South Malta

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After breakfast, begin the day with a visit to **Ghar Dalam** cave means "Cave of Darkness" in Maltese. It is the oldest pre-historic site in all of Malta and where fossils and human remains were found and giving insight into the first settlers of the island. Head to the southern fishing village of **Marsaxlokk**, picturesquely dotted with colorful fishing boats, and have lunch on the water.

After lunch, head to visit the **Hagar Qim and Mnajdra** temples, excavated for the first time in 1839, dating to 3600 - 3200 BC. It stands on a hilltop overlooking the sea and the islet of Filfla just 500m away. Then continue to the **Blue Grotto** for a boat ride through the magnificent sea caverns, Return to the *Hotel* for overnight **(B,L,D)**

Saturday, April 26 Island of Gozo



After breakfast, begin the drive to Gozo ferry terminal for a full day excursion of the **Gozo Island**, a 25-minute ferry will take us across the sea channel, to this green, rural, and traditional island of Malta; it has been rather untouched from the modern world. The island has been linked with Ogygia, home of the nymph Calypso in Homer's Odyssey. Visit the **Temples of Ggantija** (Palace of the giants); consist of two megalithic temples surrounded by a massive common boundary wall, that date to 3600 - 3200 BC. Ccontinue to **Dwejra bay**, famous for the **Azure window**, naturally carved through the rock face and have a boat ride through the cave and enjoy spectacular cliff views. Visit the capital of the island: **Victoria**, and have some free time to shop followed by lunch at Ta Rikardu's restaurant

Head to visit the **Citadel** or "**Cittadella**", first fortified during the Bronze Age and later developed by the Phoenicians and continues development and by Roman times, it had become an Acropolis complex. It is perched high up on the hill of Victoria; 360 views of the island can

be enjoyed from the top of the hill. Return to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Sunday, April 27

Valletta - USA

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight back to the US. **(B)**
