This UNESCO World Heritage Site was the easternmost outpost of the Hadramawt Kingdom .Oman is also steeped in myths and legends as it is believed to be the home of Sinbad the Sailor and the site of the ruins of the palace are reputed to be that of the Queen of Sheba.

Monday, February 10 Arrive in Muscat (OMAN)



Upon arrival in **Muscat**, meet and transfer to *Radisson Blu Hotel* for check-in and overnight.

Tuesday, February 11 Muscat



After breakfast, head to visit the **Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque**, a scientific and intellectual resource of knowledge across the Islamic world. Visit the **Royal Opera House** and explore the **Muttrah Souq**, a vibrant collection of colorful stalls filled with textiles, spices, and antiques. Later, discover the Sultanate's rich history and heritage with a visit to the **National Museum of Oman.** Visit the ceremonial **Al Alam Palace** and the adjacent former 16th century Portuguese defense forts of **Al Jalali and Mirani** from outside and get the opportunity to take some photos. Return to the *Hotel* for dinner & overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Wednesday, February 12 <u>Muscat (Bi</u>mah Sink hole, Wadi Tiwi & Sur)



After breakfast, begin the day with a drive to visit the **Bima Sinkhole**, a spectacular limestone crater with blue-green water at the bottom. Drive to **Wadi Tiwi** and walk through an old traditional village full of lush banana and papaya plantations. Continue the drive to **Sur**, the capital city of the Ash Sharqiyah region and was once an important center for trade with East Africa and India. Visit the **lighthouse** and the **old merchant houses** to admire the details of the intricately carved wooden doors, then stop at the **Dhow Yard** (granting permission) to see the dhows, trading vessels primarily used to transport heavy items. Drive back to **Muscat** and return to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D) PS: The bus cannot drive to the village in Wadi Sur, there will be an easy walk for half a mile.**

Thursday, February 13 Muscat - Nizwa



After breakfast, begin the drive to **Ibri** and visit the **Beehive Tombs** and the **Necropolis** at Bat, a prototype historic site from the 3rd millennium BCE. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant, then tour the magnificent **Jabreen Castle** built in 1675 in Bahla, one of

the finest castles in Oman. Enjoy taking some photos of **Bahla Fort**, a UNESCO Site, then continue to **Nizwa**, and upon arrival, transfer to *Golden Tulip Hotel or similar* for check-in, dinner, and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Friday, February 14 Nizwa- Muscat



After breakfast, head to visit **Nizwa Souq**. The main highlight of the Souq is the Cattle Auction that takes place every Friday. The Auction is a traditional way of selling animals like sheep, goats, cows, and camels that are brought by their owners from the nearby villages. Explore the impressive **New Souq complex**, which has been sensitively designed using Omani fort architecture and elegant Islamic arches. The air-conditioned halls of this Souq are full of fresh fruit and vegetables, herbs and spices, vast stacks of dates, and freshly caught fish. It is still the best place to buy traditional silver "Khanjars" (hand-carved Omani daggers) and Bedouin jewelry, where silver is still sold by weight.

Visit **Nizwa Fort** with its massive Circular Cannon Tower, making it one of the most impressive forts in Oman. The tower was built on a solid rock base and designed to withstand the vibrations of 24 cannons. From the top, a superb panoramic view gives a bird's eye view of Nizwa and the surrounding plains – a sure delight for all avid photographers. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant, then drive to **Muscat**. Upon arrival, transfer to *Hilton Garden Inn Hotel* or similar for check-in, dinner, and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Saturday, February 15 <u>Muscat-</u> Musandam



After breakfast, transfer to Muscat airport for our flight to **Khasab**, a port city on Oman's **Musandam Peninsula**. Upon arrival, meet the representative and begin the city tour of Khasab, including a visit to the **Khasab Fort**, a picturesque stronghold built in the 17th century by the Portuguese seeking dominion over the maritime trade in the Strait of Hormuz and to prevent attacks from the sea. The structure results from extensive restoration work in the late 20th century. Stroll around town, then transfer to *Atana Khasab Hotel* or similar for check-in. In the afternoon, board 4WD vehicles and drive to **Jabel**

Harim (Mountain of Women). The Mountain takes its name from when local women would retreat to the caves here to avoid being kidnapped by pirates or rival tribes while their husbands were away on fishing or trading expeditions. Enjoy spectacular panoramic views from the road during the mountain safari and see terraced mountain villages, lush acacia forests, and wadis. Many of the rocks on the Mountain contain well-preserved fossils of sea creatures, such as mollusks, fish, clams, and trilobites. There is also an excellent collection of **petroglyphs** carved into the borders, including human stick-figures, animal figures, and one even thought to be a man on an elephant. Return to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Sunday, February 16 Musandam



After breakfast, transfer to the **pier**, board a traditional **Omani dhow** (shared), & cruise towards Mussandam's longest and most spectacular **Fjord**, often called "Norway of Arabia." Enjoy a traditional lunch while cruising, then anchor at the vicinity off Telegraph Island, where we can enjoy a swim or sit back and relax or, be more adventurous and climb up the stairs to visit the **crumbling ruins** of the repeater station and operator's quarters (depending on the tide). Enjoy a cup of tea/coffee while on board. Return to the *Hotel*, free rest of the day at leisure and overnight. **(B,L)**

Monday, February 17 Musandam - Salalah



After breakfast, transfer to the Khasab airport for our flight to Salalah, connecting in **Muscat**. Upon arrival, transfer to *Crowne Plaza Hotel* or similar for check-in and overnight. **(B,L)**

Tuesday, February 18 Salalah (City Highlights)



Salalah is the capital and largest city of the southern Omani Governorate of Dhofar and the birthplace of the current sultan, Qaboos bin Said. The city tour begins with a visit to the "Museum of the Frankincense Land," a UNESCO World Heritage Site that opened in July 2007 at Al Balid Archaeological Park. This museum is the latest addition to Oman's heritage and cultural scene. A complete history of Oman's Maritime trade and shipbuilding industry can be experienced here, including meticulously carved replicas of the ancient boats and ships that date back to the Omani Maritime trade.

Drive through lush green fruit and vegetable plantations and make a brief stop to sample a fresh coconut water drink at one of the fruit stalls (cost on own) that line the streets within the periphery of the old Salalah town (Haffah). Also, stop for a photo opportunity at the impressive **Sultan Qaboos Mosque**, the largest mosque in Salalah, and view the official palace of his majesty the Sultan **(Al Husn Palace)**. Stroll through the old **Haffah Souk**, famous for selling high-quality Frankincense and numerous other traditional Dhofari souvenirs. This

attractive souk is full of small shops lined up with straight piles of incense boxes, clay incense burners colorfully decorated with traditional patterns, and bags of incense crystals. Have an opportunity to shop, then head for lunch at a local restaurant. Return to the *Hotel*, free rest of the day at leisure & overnight. **(B,L)**

Wednesday February 19 Salalah (Historical Highlights)



After breakfast, head to visit the old fishing village of **Tagah,** famous for the manufacturing of dried sardines and **old "Dhofari Houses"**. Then, visit the 19th century **Tagah Castle**, the former official residence of the 'Wali' (Governor) of the region and obtain a glimpse into the rich history of the region. Continue to the ancient ruins of the once famous city of **Sumharam** (Khor Rohri). This UNESCO world heritage site was the easternmost base of the **Hadramawt Kingdom** on the ancient incense route between the Mediterranean Sea, Persian Gulf, and India. A picturesque drive leads us to **Mirbat**, the ancient capital of Dhofar and the beginning of the "Frankincense Trail". Take a stroll through the streets lined with old Omani houses and head to the twin-domed Bin Ali's Tomb - a classic example of medieval architecture for some photos. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant then explore the natural spring of Ayn Razat, beautifully laid out amidst the tranquil lush mountains, and nourished every day of the year by natural underground spring water. Drive back to the hotel, rest of the evening will be free at leisure where you can explore the city on own and overnight. (B,L)

Thursday, February 20 Salalah - USA



After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight back to the US. **(B)**
