
DISCOVER THE WONDERS

Visiting Musandam city that dominates the Strait of Hormuz and have a wonderful adventure exploring its mountains and terraces. In addition, Exploring Salalah, the land of Frankincense and UNESCO world heritage site and be introduced to the famous city of Sumharam (Khor Rohri). This UNESCO World Heritage Site was the easternmost outpost of the Hadramawt Kingdom .Oman is also steeped in myths and legends as it is believed to be the home of Sinbad the Sailor and the site of the ruins of the palace are reputed to be that of the Queen of Sheba.

Monday, November 04 Muscat - Musandam



After breakfast, transfer to Muscat airport for your flight to Khasab, a port city on Oman's Musandam Peninsula. Upon arrival, Meet representative and begin the city tour of Khasab including a visit to the Khasab Fort, a picturesque stronghold built in the 17th century by the Portuguese seeking dominion over the maritime trade in the Strait of Hormuz and to prevent attacks from the sea. The structure you will see is the result of extensive restoration work carried out in the late 20th century. Stroll around the town before checking into *Atana Khasab* Hotel or similar. This afternoon jump aboard your 4WD and head to Jabel Harim (Mountain of Women). The mountain takes its name from the time when local women would retreat to the caves here to avoid being kidnapped by pirates or rival tribes while their husbands were away on fishing or trading expeditions. During your mountain safari, enjoy spectacular panoramic views from the road and see terraced mountain villages, lush acacia forests, and wadis. Many of the rocks on the mountain contain well-preserved fossils of sea creatures, such as mollusks, fish, clams, and trilobites. There is also an excellent collection of **petroglyphs** carved into the borders including human stick-figures, animal figures, and one even thought to be a man on an elephant. Return to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Tuesday, November 05 Musandam (Dhow Cruise)



After breakfast, transfer to the pier, board a traditional Omani dhow (shared), and cruise towards Mussandam's longest and spectacular **Fjord**, which is often referred as "Norway of the Arabia." Enjoy a traditional lunch while cruising, then anchor at the vicinity off Telegraph Island where you can enjoy a swim or just sit back and relax or, you can be more adventurous, climb up the stairs to visit the crumbling ruins of the repeater station and operator's quarters (depending on the tide). Enjoy your cup of Tea,

and coffee while you are on board. Return to the *Hotel*, the rest of the day free to relax and overnight. **(B, L)**

Wednesday, November 06 Musandam - Muscat - Salalah



In the morning, check-out from the hotel and transfer to the Khasab airport for the flight to Salalah connecting in Muscat. Upon arrival, transfer to *Crowne Plaza Hotel* for check-in and overnight. **(B,L)**

Thursday, November 07 Salalah (City Highlights)



Salalah, is the capital and largest city of the southern Omani Governorate of Dhofar, and the birthplace of the current sultan, Qaboos bin Said. Your city tour of Salalah begins with a visit to the "Museum of the Frankincense Land", a UNESCO World Heritage Site that opened in July 2007 at Al Balid Archaeological Park. This museum is the latest addition to Oman's heritage and cultural scene. A complete history of the Maritime trade and ship building industry of Oman can be experienced here and even include meticulously carved replicas of the ancient boats and ships that date back to the Omani Maritime trade. Next, drive through lush green fruit and vegetable plantations and make a brief stop to sample a fresh coconut water drink at one of the fruit stalls (pay on own) that line the streets within the periphery of the old Salalah town (Haffah). Also, stop for a photo opportunity at the impressive **Sultan Qaboos Mosque**, the largest mosque in Salalah and view the Official Palace of His Majesty the Sultan (Al Husn Palace). Take a stroll through the old Haffah Souk, famous for the sale of high-quality Frankincense and numerous other traditional Dhofari souvenirs. This attractive souk is full of small shops lined up with straight piles of incense boxes, clay incense burners colorfully decorated with traditional patterns and bags of incense crystals. You will have an opportunity to shop then head to have lunch at a local restaurant. After lunch, return to the resort. The rest of the evening will be at leisure. Overnight. (B,L)

Friday, November 08 Salalah (Historical Highlights)

After breakfast, visit the old fishing village of Tagah, famous for the manufacturing of dried sardines and old "Dhofari Houses". Then, visit the 19th century Taqah Castle, the former official residence of the 'Wali' (Governor) of the region and obtain a glimpse into the rich history of the region. Continue onto the ancient ruins of the once famous city of **Sumharam (Khor Rohri)**. This UNESCO World Heritage Site was the easternmost outpost of the Hadramawt Kingdom on the ancient incense route between the Mediterranean Sea, Persian Gulf, and India. A picturesque drive then leads you to Mirbat, the ancient capital of Dhofar and the beginning of the "Frankincense Trail". Take a stroll through the streets lined with old Omani houses and stop to take a photo of the twin-domed Bin Ali's Tomb - a classic example of medieval architecture. On the way back to the hotel, explore the natural spring of Ayn Razat, beautifully laid out amidst the tranquil lush mountains, and nourished every day of the year by a natural underground spring water. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant before returning to the Crowne Plaza Resort or similar. The rest of the evening will be at leisure for further exploring the city on own and overnight. (B, L)

Saturday, November 09 Salalah - Muscat



After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight to Muscat. Upon arrival, You will be met by our representative and transferred to *Park Inn by Radisson Hotel or similar* for check in, rest of the day at leisure and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Sunday, November 10 Muscat - USA



Enjoy your breakfast and then transfer to the Airport for your flight back home. **(B)**




Special Notes on Travel:

Touring - You will be covering a lot during this journey. The roads are good, and the bus is very comfortable. Some driving days are long, but there will be several restrooms stops along the way.
