# Tuesday, November 26 Arrive in Karachi (PAKISTAN)



Upon arrival in Karachi, meet and transfer to Pearl Continental Hotel or similar for check-in and have some rest. Meet for lunch and later head to visit the Mohatta Palace Museum near Clifton Beach, where unique collections of art and textiles are on display. The Mohatta Palace was built in 1927 by Shivratan Chandraratan Mohatta, a Hindu Marwari merchant from modern-day Rajasthan in India. After separation, the palace became the state's property and initially housed Pakistan's foreign affairs office when Karachi was the capital of Pakistan. After the capital was moved to Islamabad, the palace became the private residence of Fatima Jinnah, a Pakistani dental surgeon, political leader, and one of the founders of Pakistan. Later, the Sindh government converted it into a museum and meticulously restored it to its former glory. Return to the Hotel for dinner and overnight. (D)

Note: Standard check-in time is 3:00 pm. If you arrive on November 25 or in the early morning of November 26, an extra hotel night needs to be booked.

#### Wednesday, November 27 Karachi



After breakfast, begin the tour of **Karachi** with a visit to the **Mausoleum of Muhammad Ali Jinnah**, the founder of Pakistan. Then continue to the **National Museum of Pakistan** with its numerous galleries. The museum features many artifacts, including objects from the pre and ancient history of the region (5000 to 1500 BC). After lunch, visit the **Saddar Bazaar** (Empress Market) & Zainab Market. Return to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

#### Thursday, November 28 Karachi - Ormara (5 hrs.)



Begin the day with a drive to Ormara following the route taken by Alexander the Great back from India over 2300 years ago, head to visit **Hingol National Park**, the largest in Pakistan. The park is famous for the mud volcanoes, rugged rock formations and it's Hindu temple. Then continue the drive to **Ormara** and upon arrival, transfer to *Ormara Hotel* or similar for check-in, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

# Friday, November 29 Ormara - Gwadar



Begin the day with a drive to **Gwadar**, an important fishing (sardines & sharks) and trade center. Upon arrival, head to visit **Shahi bazzar**, one of the oldest markets in Balochistan and it has been a public place dating back a few centuries. It is located along a narrow street. Also, visit the **Corniche**, where we may get the opportunity to see some of the traditional ship building. After the visit, transfer to *Pearl Continental Hotel* or similar for check-in, dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

# Saturday, November 30



Gwadar (Pasni) - Ormara (2.5 hrs.)

Enjoy an early breakfast and then drive to **Pasni**, a major coastal city of Baluchistan and the starting point for our trip to **Astola Island**. Board a chartered boat to Astola, a stunningly beautiful uninhabited island off the coast of Baluchistan. Spend the day on Astola Island, exploring its natural sights and chilling at the beach. After the island experience, return back to Makran Coast and head back to the *Hotel* in Ormara for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

#### Sunday, December 01 Ormara - Khuzdar (6.5hrs.)



Enjoy an early breakfast then begin the drive to **Khuzdar**, via Makran Coastal highway (N-10) & Regional cooperation for development highway. Enroute visit Gondari caves, 11 miles north-west of Las Bela, at Gandakahar, near the ruins of an ancient town. So far no one knows clearly about this site. There are many myths and stories. Until the century this part was also under Buddhist influence and same with these caves show definite Buddhist characteristics. According to another source, Journal of the Society for South Asian Studies, the site cannot be conclusively linked to Buddhist heritage, it is links with other civilizations too. Upon arrival, transfer to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

#### Monday, December 02 Kuzdar



Begin the day with an excursion to **Moola Chatok** (2.5 hrs.) situated in the middle of the Khuzdar District in Baluchistan and 65 miles north-east of Khuzdar. The area is surrounded by rocky cliffs and mountains. As a subtehsil. Moola is said to be home to the Hidden Saint —

where locals built a shrine for Pir Chattal, the biggest pir of Balochistan at one of the water pools in the area. The fish harboring these pools swim back and forth from the shrine as if to protect it. Enjoy a picnic lunch and enjoy the scenery and then return to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

## Tuesday, December 03 Kuzdar - Quetta (4.5 hrs.)

Enjoy an early breakfast and begin the drive to **Quetta** via Regional Cooperation for Development Hwy. En route, stop in the city of **Kalat**, famous for the **Meeri Fort** which overlooks the city then continue the drive to **Quetta**, and head to visit the friendliest Bazaar in Asia and bustling bazaar which are **Suraj Ganj** and **Liaqat Bazaars**, where people from around country come to do business, then transfer to the *Hotel* for check-in, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

# Wednesday, December 04 Quetta (Ziarat)



After breakfast, begin the drive to **Ziarat** for a visit. It is famous for being the second largest Juniper forest in the world. It was the summer residence of the chief commissioner of Baluchistan, and sanatorium for the European troops. After the visit, return to the *Hotel* for dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

#### Thursday, December 05 Quetta - Sukkur (5.5 hrs.)



Begin the day with a drive to Sibi through the Bolan Pass via N-65. Head to visit the **Sibi Mela**, a place where tribesmen flock from all over Baluchistan, parts of Sind, and Punjab bring their animals and trade. The salient features of this "Mela" are horse and cattle and cultural shows, tent pegging, camel races, animal markets, and exhibitions of handicrafts, tribal dresses, and folk dances. Continue the drive to Sukkur via N-65/AH2 and upon arrival, transfer to the Hoel for check-in, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

## Friday, December 06 Sukkur - Larkana



Begin the day with a drive to **Kot Deji** archaeological site and visit the famous **fort** of the state of Khairpur. This site stands on one of the rare outcroppings of limestone part of the Rohri Hills to the north. The site dates from 3500 to 2500 BC and has two distinct parts. Excavation of the upper level revealed pottery of the Harappan civilization, while the lower levels exposed evidence of an unknown pre-Harappan culture, designated as Kot Deji. Later explore the famous archaeological site of **Mohenjo-Daro**, one of the most important archaeological sites in South Asia and one of the best preserved and restored prehistoric sites in the world. Built in 2500BC, it was one of the largest settlements of the ancient Indus Valley and concurrent with ancient Egypt and Minoan Crete. The site was first excavated by the Indian Archaeological Survey team under Sir John Marshall in 1922 and 1931, and then by Sir Mortimer Wheeler in 1947. Now in the hands of the Pakistan Archaeological Survey team and

supported by UNESCO, the site is excellently presented. Tour the great **bath**, the **granary**, the **College square** and **Pillared Hall**, **private homes**, and the **Mohenjo-Daro Museum**. Transfer to *Sambara Inn* or similar for check-in, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

#### Saturday, December 07 Larkana - Hayderabad



After breakfast, begin the drive to **Larkana** and head to visit the impressive **Shrine of Lal Shahbaz Qalandar**, as the 13th century Sufi saint and religious poet Syed Usman Marvandi was known. His writings are still celebrated in present-day Pakistan and Afghanistan. Transfer to *Indus Hotel* or similar for check-in, dinner & overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

#### Sunday, December 08 Hayderabad - Karachi



After breakfast, begin the drive to **Karachi**, stopping en route at **Thatta**, the medieval capital of Sindh. Visit the 17th-century Grand Mosque of Shah Jahan, a gift he made in recognition of the hospitality he received in Thatta while seeking refuge from his father, Jahangir. The mosque is a contemporary of Shah Jahan's famous Taj Mahal in Agra, India. Visit the **Historical Monuments** at Makli, one of Pakistan's most visually stunning archaeological sites. Covering over 9.3 miles and said to contain over one million tombs, it is considered the world's largest necropolis. Tour the tombs of Jam Nizammudin, Isa Khan Tarkhan, Jan Baba, and Diwan Shurfa Khan. Finally, visit the Chokondhi to view the tombs that are thought to be from the 13th - 16th century and are attributed to the Jokhio and Baluch tribes. These superbly carved sandstone tombs are built out of rectangular slabs placed one on top of the other in a pyramidal fashion, some reaching 13 feet in height. They stretch for several miles along a low ridge with two large domed mausoleums in the center. This style of tomb is found only in the Sindh and Baluchistan provinces, particularly along the coast of Makran, and their intricate designs are still applied to the textiles, pottery, jewelry, and woodcarving in those regions. Return to the PC Continental Hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

#### Monday, December 09 Karachi - USA



Transfer to the airport for your flight back to the US. (B)
