

About Robert Bedeski

Dr. Robert E. Bedeski is Professor Emeritus in the Department of Political Science at the University of Victoria, and Affiliate Professor at REECAS, Jackson School of International Studies, and University of Washington. He is also Honorary Professor at the University of British Columbia's Institute of Asian Research. In 2008, he received an Honorary Doctorate from the Mongolia Academy of Sciences and was Visiting Aung San Suu Kyi Endowed Chair in Asian



Democracy at the University of Louisville, Kentucky (2008-09).

He was born in Detroit and went to Cass Technical High School. He served in the U.S. Army in Korea and Taiwan, received a doctorate in political science at the University of California (Berkeley). He has held professor positions at Ohio State University, Carleton University (Ottawa) and the University of Victoria.

He has lived in China, South Korea, Taiwan, and Japan, and traveled globally. He has lectured tours to China, Russia, and Mongolia extensively. He speaks and reads Chinese. Since the beginning of his academic career, Dr. Bedeski has focused on the structure and formation of the Asian state in China, Japan, and Korea. Professor Bedeski is currently writing books on Genghis Khan and also a study of Korean political history. His books and articles include political studies of China, Japan, Mongolia, Korea, and Taiwan.
