THE LAND OF THE CATTLE HERDERS

November 16 - November 23, 2024

No doubt, that South Sudan is one of the most challenging destinations for the intrepid traveler like you but this country, which gained its independence in 2011 earning the title of the world newest country has apprehended the attention from all travelers around the world with their prehistoric cultural rituals, a countless colorful local tribes and untouched natural beauty.

Your expedition starts and ends in Juba, the capital of the young nation, where you will wander around the city and overnight to experience what the nightlife has to offer. Our extensive tour allows you to experience the genuine South Sudan by heading out of the very strictly controlled capital and visiting not one but four ethnic communities with the freedom to interact, photograph and learn directly from the locals. This is something that only a very few visitors experience. You will journey with us to the incredible Lotuko people, the main ethnic group living around Torit Town in villages nestled in the hills and hidden among the rocks. In addition, the Boya people, called "Larim people", who are centered on a small and rather ramshackle settlement in the shadow of the mountains and gigantic boulders and the Toposa people, known as fierce warriors and cattle stealers. They live in villages made of mud and sticks with thatched roofs often adorned with the skulls of cattle. You will end the tour with a visit to the Mundari tribes - herders who live in the wild in symbiosis with their cattle. They are unmistakable as they cover their whole body in chalk-like makeup, making them appear as ghosts.

Saturday, November 16

Arrive in Juba (South Sudan)



Upon arrival in **Juba**, the Capital town of South Sudan, meet and transfer to *Pyramid Continental Hotel* for check-in, enjoy lunch and then head to tour the city and enjoy the views of the river Nile before returning to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(L)**

Sunday, November 17

Juba - Kapoeta Town (Taposo Villages) (4 hrs.)



Enjoy breakfast, then head in the early morning (7:00am) to the airport for your flight to **Kapoeta** (approx. 35min), the largest settlement in the heartland of the **Taposa people**. Upon arrival, head to the **Taposa village**, the day will be fully dedicated to the Taposa people, a Nilotic-speaking pastoralist tribe famous for the unique architecture of its traditional fortified villages. Get the opportunity to understand the compound culture of these isolated and highly misunderstood people, which since the mid-80s, have been at the center of tribal conflicts and full-scale wars. Also, get the chance to interact with the people, may dress in their local attire, and help the host in their daily activities. Drive back to Kapoeta and transfer to *Kuleu Hotel* for check-in, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Monday, November 18

Kapoeta Town (Boya Village) (4 Hrs.)



After breakfast, at 8:30, begin the drive passing through more of the Taposa villages until we reach **Boya Villages**. Also known as the Boya or Narim, the Laarim are a Nilotic people living in the Boya Hills. We will pay our respect to the elders and then introduce ourselves to the rest of the

tribe, then spend the whole day visiting nearby **villages** and learning more about their culture. This will be an excellent opportunity to interact with the Boya people and see them in their settlement. Like many neighboring ethnic groups, the Larim engage in pastoralism and subsistence farming. Their religion is also based on ancestor worship. We could even see some rituals and ceremonies. Also, have the opportunity to take some photos and then visit some of the surrounding villages before we drive back to the *Hotel* in **Kapoeta** for dinner and overnight **(B,L,D)**

Tuesday, November 19

Kapoeta Town - Juba



Enjoy breakfast, then head in the early morning (7:00am) to the airport for your flight back to **Juba** and upon arrival head to the **Mundari Cattle camp** in the town of Terekeka. It is a semi-nomadic cattle herder that, despite the proximity to Juba and the collateral effect of the South Sudanese Civil War, has managed to keep its tribal way of life almost intact. Transfer to *Pyramid Continental Hotel* for check-in, and overnight. **(B,L)**

Wednesday, November 20

Juba (Mundari Cattle Camp)



Spend the whole day with the Mundari tribe, a traditional ethnic group known for their facial scarring and traditional rituals. We will pay our respect to the **Mundari** elders and then introduce ourselves to the rest of the tribe. The day will have plenty of activities, from dressing yourself in the local attire and ash markings to taking photos with the tribe to helping the host with activities. Also, get a chance to feed the animals, take some photos, and then

visit the villages nearby before returning to the *Hotel* in Juba for overnight. **(B,L)**

Thursday, November 21

Juba - Bor Town (Sudd swamp & Fishing tribes)

(3.30 hrs.)



Enjoy breakfast, and then depart in the early morning driving to **Bor Town** was a "wooding station" for steamers travelling along the White Nile (Bahr al Jabal River). In 1905, Bor was established as the headquarters of the Bor District. Bor became an administrative center under the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan (1899-1956) for the Dinka Bor people. Explore the Dinka tribe and tour the **fishing villages** of the Dinka tribe in the nearby islands and spend the whole day with them. Transfer to *Park Palace Hotel* for check-in, dinner and overnight. **(B,L,D)**

Friday, November 22

Bor Town - Juba



After breakfast, drive back to **Juba** and head to the *Hotel* for check-in, have a city tour, including visits to the **markets** and the city's **Art Gallery**, then enjoy lunch by the Nile. Free afternoon at leisure and overnight at the *Hotel*. **(B,L)**

Saturday, November 23

Juba - USA



After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight back to the US. **(B)**

Trip Grade:

III Challenging - Parts of the trip will be physically challenging, involve hiking on rough terrain or in sand or at high altitudes. There may be very long drives on rough roads, weather conditions with high heat or humidity, and presence of insects. You may have simple picnic lunches, primitive bathroom facilities along the road and remoteness from modern towns or cities.

Lodging Level:

★ **Simple** - One or more properties on the trip are very basic, rustic, primitive, with shared bathroom facilities (1 or 2 stars)



Tour does not include:

- International airfare in and out of Juba.
- South Sudan Visa (obtainable online - <https://www.onlinevisa.com/south-sudan-visa/> **Your passport must not include Israeli stamps.**)
- **Alien certificate** done within 72 hours of arrival in South Sudan (\$65.00 - to be paid in cash).
- Beverages or drinks with or without meals and lunches & dinners while in Juba.
- Any PCR tests required pre arrival or pre departure.
- Items of a personal nature (camera fees, laundry, excess luggage, etc.).
- Transfers if not arriving/departing on tour dates.
- Dayroom/overnights necessitated by changes in airline schedules or misconnections.
- Trip surcharge to operate below required minimum participants.
- Travel protection Insurance (HIGHLY recommended).
