Leaving Damascus, you'll head east site of Palmyra, an oasis in the Syrian Desert, containing the monumental ruins of a great city that was one of the most important cultural centers of the ancient world. Continue north to Syria's second-largest city, Aleppo. Complete your circular route with stops in Hama and Ma'aloula as you return to Damascus. Experience the warmth of the people, the tastes of the cuisine, the aromas of the souks, and the majesty of the past, and explore some of the best-preserved Roman cities in the Near East as well as Byzantine gems and Islamic jewels!

## Friday, April 18 Arrive in Beirut(LEBANON



Upon arrival in Beirut, the capital of Lebanon, and considered one of the oldest cities in the world with a history dating back over 5,000 years. After passing through customs at the airport, meet and transfer to *Rouche Arjann by Rotana* or similar for check-in and overnight.

### Saturday, April 19 Beirut - Damascus (SYRIA)



Begin the day with a drive to the Lebanese Syrian borders; after the formalities, continue the drive to Damascus, and walk through the famous Souk al Hamidieh of Damascus, built during the Ottoman days on the Documanus Maximus. Start the day by visiting the **Umayyad Mosque**, also known as the Great Mosque of Damascus, in the heart of the old city. The mosque was built on the location of Temple Haddad during the Aramaic era, which Jupiter replaced in the Roman days, and converted into a church in the Christian dynasty. Head to visit the Saladin tomb, and in the afternoon, walk along "the Straight Street," the famous street mentioned in the bible. Have dinner at a traditional Damascene house in the old city and then transfer to Beit Zamman Hotel or similar for check-in and overnight. (B,L,D)

### Sunday, April 20 Damascus



Begin the day by visiting **St. Paul's window**, which is believed to be where St. Paul lowered in a basket and escaped the city. Continue to visit the **National Museum** to learn about the history of Syria and see its fantastic collection of artifacts. Then head to **Tekkieh Sulyamanieh**, built during the time of Suliman the Magnificent. Continue to visit **Azem Palace**, built by the governor of Damascus in the 18th century. It has all the characteristics that elaborate the style of the Damascene

houses. In the afternoon, walk through **Qaimayrieh Street** and continue the walk along "the Straight Street," the famous street mentioned in the bible. Later, we visit **Anania's house**. Ananias was the disciple who heeled St. Paul when he came to Damascus. Enjoy dinner at a traditional Damascene house in the city and then head back to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

### Monday, April 21 Damascus - Palmyra - Hama



Begin the day with a long drive to the **Syrian Steppe** and visit the ruins of one of the most famous cities in the Middle East, **Palmyra**. In ancient times, it was the home of Queen Zenobia. At the end of the 3rd century AD, she defied the Romans and was consequently destroyed by them. One of Syria's most magnificent ancient sites, Palmyra spreads over many acres and has an abundance of entire edifices from the 2nd century AD. In the late afternoon, Continue the drive to Hama and, upon arrival, transfer to *Apamea Cham Palace Hotel* or similar for check-in, dinner, and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

### Tuesday, April 22 Hama - Aleppo



Begin the day by visiting the vast iconic **Waterwheels** (called Norias) used in medieval times to water the city's gardens. The largest of them measures close to 70 feet in diameter. Continue the drive to **Aleppo**, one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world. Spend the afternoon walking through the **Old City** along its narrow alleyways and past its large mansions and ancient caravanserais. In the afternoon, visit the **souks** of Aleppo, parts of which have been demolished in the war, but some sections are still the same as it was in the past - lively and crowded and very colorful. Enjoy dinner at a traditional Aleppo restaurant and then transfer to *Arman Hotel* or similar for check-in and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

### Wednesday, April 23 Aleppo

Spend the day exploring Aleppo, the second largest city in Syria, beginning with a visit to the newly renovated **Archaeological Museum** to learn more about Syria's archeology. Explore the 13th-century **Citadel of Aleppo**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, considered one of the world's oldest and largest medieval castles. Also, walk through the **Armenian Quarter**, known for its narrow alleyways, finely decorated churches, and mansions. Enjoy dinner at a traditional Aleppo restaurant, then return to the *Hotel* for overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

### Thursday, April 24 Aleppo - Christian Valley



After breakfast we drive to the **Christian Valley** to visit one of the most spectacular crusader castles in the world, **Krak des Chevaliers**, built during the First Crusade in a strategically important spot in Syria's Al Ansariyah Mountains. In the afternoon, continue the drive towards the **Christian Valley**, stopping in Homs to visit **Saint George Monastery**, built over the remains of a 6th-century AD structure considered the original monastery. The monastery was built with Byzantine stone and contained images depicting scenes of the life of the famous St. George and other ancient artifacts such as books and crosses. Dinner will be at a typical restaurant in the Christian Valley, then transfer to *Al Wadi Hotel* or similar for check-in and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

### Friday, April 25 Christian Valley- Ma'lula- Damascus



After breakfast, drive back to Damascus via Ma'aloula, a small village built into the rugged mountainside at an altitude of more than 4,500 feet. It is known as one of three remaining villages where the ancient Aramaic language is still spoken. Ma'aloula has two Christian sites dating back to the early days of Christianity - Saint Takla Shrine and Saints Sergius and Bacchus Monastery. St. Takla is a beautiful convent built into the side of a mountain. Saints Sergius (St. Sarkis) and Bacchus is one of the oldest monasteries in Syria that still retains its historic character. Upon arrival in Damascus, transfer to Beit Zamman Hotel or similar for check-in, then head out and enjoy a farewell dinner at one of the prominent restaurants in the city, then return to the Hotel for overnight. (B,L,D)

# Saturday, April 26 Damascus - Beirut (LEBANON)



Enjoy a free morning at leisure, and then after lunch, drive back to Beirut and transfer to *Rouche Arjann by Rotana Hotel* or similar for check-in, dinner, and overnight. **(B,L,D)** 

## Sunday, April 27 Beirut- USA



Transfer to the airport for your flight back home. (B)
